Gifts of Stocks, Bonds & Mutual Funds: Double the tax benefits of your gift

Donating long-term appreciated assets is one of the most tax-efficient ways to give. When you donate securities, you avoid capital gains taxes and can claim a charitable deduction for the full fair market value.

This type of giving allows you to support conservation without dipping into your cash reserves. It's an excellent strategy for donors who hold assets that have grown in value and want to make a meaningful impact while preserving liquidity.

HOW TO DONATE SECURITIES

Donor Advised Funds: Flexible giving on your timeline

Donor Advised Funds, or DAFs, offer an easy and flexible way to support the causes you care about. With a donor-advised fund, you can make a charitable contribution, receive an immediate tax benefit, and then recommend grants to Stowe Land Trust over time.

You can also name Stowe Land Trust as a final beneficiary, ensuring that the remaining balance of your fund supports conservation in perpetuity. Many families find DAFs to be a helpful tool for involving younger generations in their philanthropy.

For those who care deeply about land, a gift of real estate is one of the most direct and lasting ways to make a difference. Land can be gifted in several forms: undeveloped woodlands, farmland, a family homestead, or even residential or commercial property. Whether it's a beloved property you want to see protected or an asset you no longer need, your gift can help ensure the beauty and character of this region remain intact.

Some donors contribute land with high conservation value for permanent protection. Others donate property that may be sold, with proceeds supporting Stowe Land Trust's conservation and stewardship work. Either way, the impact is significant: gifts of real estate help protect critical wildlife habitat, preserve scenic views, connect trail networks, and support working lands.

Stowe Land Trust works closely with donors and their advisors to evaluate the land, understand your goals, and determine the most effective way to structure the gift. Gifts can be immediate or planned, full or partial interests, and may even include retained life estates that allow you to continue using the land during your lifetime.


HOW TO MAKE A GIFT OF LAND

Retirement Assets:

Turn taxable assets into tax-free gifts

Retirement accounts such as IRAs and 401(k)s are often subject to income taxes when inherited by individuals. There are two ways to make a gift from your retirement account. Designating Stowe Land Trust as a beneficiary of your retirement account is a highly tax-efficient way to make a gift. If you are 70 ½ or older, you also can make a Qualified Charitable Donation directly from your retirement account to Stowe Land Trust. A QCD does not count as taxable income but does count toward your Required Minimum Distribution.

This simple act can make a profound impact while preserving other assets for your loved ones.

HOW TO DONATE RETIREMENT ASSETS

- To make a gift from your retirement account after your passing, simply update your beneficiary to Stowe Land Trust. No changes to your will are required.
- To make a QCD, contact your IRA custodian and request a direct distribution to Stowe Land Trust, 6 Sunset Street, Stowe, Vermont 05672, EIN: 03-0307155.





Life Insurance:

Transform your policy into conservation

Life insurance can be a powerful way to make a meaningful gift to Stowe Land Trust—either now or in the future. You can name Stowe Land Trust as a full or partial beneficiary, or transfer ownership of a policy and potentially receive an immediate tax deduction.


Another option is to sell a no-longer-needed policy through a life settlement. This can result in a higher return than surrendering the policy, allowing you to donate the proceeds and make a larger impact. You'll also eliminate future premium payments and may qualify for a charitable income tax deduction.


Your attorney or financial advisor will need to draft the trust document, specifying term, payout rate, and remainder beneficiary.


PINNACLE SOCIETY, \$1,000+
